Executive Summary

The Black Arts District and Intersection of Change have partnered to create a new multi-million dollar arts, culture and community campus known as the Sanaa Center, a two-part development project which includes the expansion of the Harris-Marcus Center and the ground up development of a new art center.

The Sanaa Center, will create a block of arts and cultural institutions in the 1900 block of Pennsylvania Avenue in Baltimore, MD. The Sanaa Center will attract more people and investment to the area, serve as a local economic and cultural engine that will empower Black creatives, strengthen the Historic Pennsylvania Avenue business corridor, and bolster the arts ecosystem both in Baltimore and the surrounding region.

In order to design the Sanaa Center the Black Arts District and Intersection of Change have enlisted the support of several development partners including the Civic Group, Drummond Projects and Joltage.





Executive Summary

The Civic Group is a public-minded development firm that creates best-in-class spaces that strengthen communities, drive economic value, and beautify the built environment. Drummond Projects is a civic-minded architectural studio interested in reinforcing the relationship between people and place. Joltage is a social change design firm that champions innovative solutions to social challenges. These partners are working to gather feedback from community members and stakeholders to guide the design the Sanga Center.

This report outlines the community engagement process and findings related to History, Culture and Legacy; People, Program and Activities and Building Designs for the Sanaa Center. The themes and insights shared in this report are intended to guide the physical design, community programming and partnerships of the Sanaa Center. The creation of the Sanaa Center is an ongoing process and the Black Arts District and Intersection of Change will continue to engage and gather additional feedback from community members and stakeholders.

Sanaa Center Community Engagement







BUILDING DESIGN

SUMMARY

Community members provided valuable insights into the major themes that should guide the architectural design of the Sanaa Center.

Key considerations include the creation of artist studios to foster freedom of expression and income generation, the establishment of a cafe/bar as a profitable and community-building space, and the provision of dedicated studios for various art forms. Additionally, the inclusion of performance spaces, both large and small, is emphasized to accommodate diverse art forms and community events. Office spaces are essential to support artists and non-profit organizations, while classrooms and educational programs and spaces promote learning and skill development.

Furthermore, spaces for health and wellness, outdoor and green areas, historical markers, and child and youth-focused programs and spaces are highlighted for inclusivity and cultural significance. The center should also prioritize spaces that foster inclusivity and collaboration with community organizations.

These insights collectively offer a comprehensive blueprint for the Sanaa Center that caters to diverse artistic, social, and community needs.

- Artist Studios: There is a strong demand for artist studios that provide freedom of expression and serve as income generators. These studios should accommodate various art forms, including digital art, traditional art, and music, and contribute to building a community of artists.
- Cafe/Bar: Creating a cafe or bar space is seen as a profitable venture that can
 foster community engagement, provide a safe space to hang out, and serve as a
 hub for networking and cultural exchange. It should also offer co-working facilities
 and healthy food options.
- Creative Studios: Spaces dedicated to specific art forms such as ceramics, dance, photography, sewing, and recording are essential. These studios should encourage hands-on creation, skill development, and multi-generational participation.
- Performance Spaces: The center should include both large and small performance spaces to accommodate various art forms, including theater, dance, music, and film. These spaces should be flexible, revenue-generating, and capable of hosting community events and performances.


- Office Spaces: Office spaces are needed to support artists, non-profit organizations, and individuals working on community initiatives. These spaces should facilitate collaboration and professional development.

- Health and Wellness: The inclusion of mental health wellness spaces and mindfulness areas reflects the importance of well-being in the community. These spaces can offer holistic healing modalities and promote mental health.

- Outdoor and Green Spaces: Utilizing outdoor areas for concerts, festivals, markets, and art installations is essential for engaging the community and creating an inviting atmosphere. Rooftop gardens and community gardens are also suggested.
- Inclusivity and Accessibility: The center should be designed with inclusivity in mind, ensuring accessibility for individuals with disabilities and providing spaces that cater to diverse communities.
- Historical and Cultural Significance: Historical markers and spaces celebrating
 the heritage of the community, including figures like Billie Holiday, are
 recommended to honor the area's cultural significance.
- Interdisciplinary Spaces: The inclusion of maker spaces, technology labs, and workshops for woodworking, metalworking, and glass blowing can foster creativity and provide skill-building opportunities.

These principles can collectively guide architects to create a Sanaa Center that is a thriving hub for creativity, education, and community-building, welcoming individuals of all backgrounds and abilities.

- Diversity and Inclusivity: Create spaces that cater to a diverse range of artistic forms, skill levels, ages, and backgrounds, fostering inclusivity and accessibility for all community members.
- Multifunctionality: Design spaces with the flexibility to serve multiple purposes, ensuring that areas can be easily adapted for various activities, such as performances, workshops, and community gatherings.
- Community Engagement: Prioritize community-building by providing areas that encourage social interaction, networking, and collaboration among artists, residents, and visitors.
- Artistic Expression: Foster artistic expression by offering dedicated studios and workshops for various art forms, including visual arts, music, dance, photography, and more.

- **Learning and Education**: Support lifelong learning and skill development through classrooms, educational programs, and training spaces that empower individuals to explore and nurture their creative talents.
- Performance Spaces: Include both large and small performance spaces to accommodate a wide range of artistic events, from large-scale performances to intimate showcases, promoting the vibrant cultural scene of the center.
- Functional Workspaces: Provide functional office spaces and co-working areas for artists, non-profit organizations, and entrepreneurs, promoting productivity and collaboration.
- Wellness and Mindfulness: Design spaces that promote mental and physical well-being, including mindfulness areas, therapy spaces, and opportunities for holistic healing practices.

- Heritage and History: Incorporate historical markers and archive spaces to celebrate and preserve the cultural heritage and artistic legacies of the community.

- Pillars & Principles: Use the themes and insights from the community engagement process to identify a set of
 pillars and principles that can be used as a North Star to guide key decision making in the development of the
 Sanaa Center.
- Programs & Partnerships: Producing, developing and integrating the thoughts and ideas that community
 members and stakeholders shared during the community engagement process will require the Sanaa Center to
 develop community and organizational partnerships. The Sanaa Center should explore and create partnerships
 over the course of the project to support the program development of the center.
- Phases & Pipelines: Artists, creatives, community members and other stakeholders shared so many thoughts
 and ideas for making the Sanaa Center successful that it would be extremely difficult to develop and
 incorporate them all into the center at the same time. The Sanaa Center should identify and prioritize the
 thoughts and ideas shared by community members and stakeholders, develop programs related to them and
 divide them into phases that allows the center to create pipelines that produce and develop programming over
 time.
